Update by Jennifer Anderson: We have three full day weeks confirmed. We end school mid-week, with 6/23, 6/30, and 8/4 camp weeks. Camps have morning and afternoon sessions, and there are 64 different options. There are a few repeat camp topics – drawing, Lego, crafts. Once we receive all information from teachers, Cheddar Up will create a sign-up. Between April and June 2025, we will determine if camps can be filled and what options might be, if not. Advertisement to consist of social media, Bloomz, and possibly a flier. Camps are pretty evenly split between middle and elementary schools. The third week usually has less attendees, but we are still looking to fill all camp slots. The potential exists to have a summer camp directly after summer academy for those students. TBD.

We will be doing an early bird discount. Discussion has been had as to considering an increase in the base camp rate. However, all camps have gone up price-wise, so no increase at this time.

 \rightarrow Jennifer Anderson is looking to pass on responsibilities of being Chair of summer camp. It is all online and hours can be whatever works for anyone who can take on this responsibility.

 \rightarrow One member asked about extending camp until 4pm. However, camps are at the mercy of hours as offered by the school. The school only allows until 3pm.

PTA Funded Clubs - Steph Billingsley

- PTA would fund stipend for teacher
- Application Process
 - Minimum # of Students
 - Open to multiple grades/classes
 - Minimum # of Weeks
 - Teacher will need to be a PTA Member (for insurance purposes)
- PTA would only fund max of 3-4 clubs per year

- Board would review application when submitted to make sure meets guidelines & approve (rather than waiting for next meeting to have members vote - could delay start of club)
- First come first serve basis?
- Propose add \$1500 line item to budget VOTE

Update by Steph Billingsley: Met with Dr. Collins today, 1/21/2025. We had talked about this last year, but such was deferred due to school budget concerns. PTA would like to fund teachers who would like to do clubs. There will be a minimum number of students per club for multiple grade levels, as well as a minimum number of weeks. The cost includes per meeting with the kids over an 8-12 week course, at \$75 per meeting. The thought is that there will be 3-4 clubs per year. The teacher overseeing the club needs to be a PTA member for insurance purposes. With clubs, if a teacher meets requirements in the application, the PTA board can approve on a first-come, first-serve basis so long as the offerings covered a variety of the student base. We can set a line item, and vote to increase same if the demand is high.

These clubs will be in addition to clubs already offered by the school. It is a process to otherwise get a stipend approved from the school for new clubs. The goal is to provide the students with different options throughout the year. If we have a budget approved, we should be able to move relatively quickly. It starts with teachers, admin approval, then PTA board vote. This would need to be an annual line item in the PTA budget.

 \rightarrow Do the clubs continue in years to come or does it require a new application in the years that follow? Perhaps deference to the teacher running the club? How do current clubs work? Towards the end of each school year, Ms. Aubin reaches out to teachers and gauges interest in established clubs moving forward. We would likely need to renew on an annual basis. Student interest is definitely there!

 \rightarrow Something to consider is a form or forum for feedback with the club, e.g. how many students, positives/negatives, things to do differently, etc.?

Financial Report: Treasurer: Andrea Sankovich

Update by Andrea Sankovich: Showing transactions that took place over November and December 2024. First, Barnes & Noble netted just over \$1,000 for the book fair. In comparison to last year in which we netted \$53.00.

Fall fundraising net was just over \$2600. Regarding the movie night, we profited almost \$1400, which is just ~\$900 less than last year (which includes a vendor fair and all that comes with it).

Principal Update: Principal: Dr. Collins

Update by Jennifer Barnhill: It has been very busy, but we are back into the swing of things. This week, we are doing our first STEAM night with Ms. Reinhalt. There are many volunteers coming to do demonstrations, e.g. Auburn Police Department and a fingerprint demonstration. The date is Friday, 1.24.2025 at 6pm. There will also be food being served in the cafeteria! Should be a lot of fun.

The 8th graders are going to Pinkerton next week for a tour, and will explore different options that the school presents. The 8th graders will also be going to the Krista McAuliffe museum.

Next week is the great kindness challenge with a K-8 spirit week and scavenger hunt. Fun activities are planned for lunches. National school counselor week is also upcoming. Looking out, the next dance is 2/7/2025. Attendance at dances has been ebbing a bit. Curious as to feedback from kids. It's a great opportunity for the kids to mingle.

Early release on 2.12.2025. The one this month was helpful, as teachers did emergency response and cyber security training. Later in February, there will be family folk dance night (no longer part of night of the arts).

Middle school invention convention is also upcoming. No longer an end of year project thing. It has been moved up so that we can participate in the state competition at UNH. We sent some kids last year. There has been a lot more buy-in from students mid-year vs. year-end.

School Board Update: Adrian Newton

Update by Adrian Newton: Met on 1/14/2025 to finalize budget for next school year. Next year's budget includes a 9.2% increase from this year. Very large increase in quite a long time. There is some misconception on social media. The increase is not because of the budget issues from last year. The main driver of the increase is salary/benefits, Pinkerton tuition (up 5.8%), and special education. There is no cap on percentage increase with Pinkerton, so we are at their mercy. Pinkerton is experiencing a slight decline in enrollment, but they want to keep staffing, services, etc. at the same level. Their way to adjust is to charge us more money. The 9.2% increase is over \$19 million dollars. This will be on the March 2025 warrant article.

 \rightarrow What happens if this doesn't get approved? The default budget is a couple hundred thousand less than the over \$19 million amount. We would need to make up this difference somehow if the warrant article doesn't pass. The difference between the default budget and what is proposed is de minimus. It will be important to show up.

The town deliberative session is 2/1/2025 at 9am. The school district will speak to the budget at this time, and it is also a chance for the community to add/detract from the budget. There is

some concern here given the 9.2% increase and how residents may respond to that. There are not a lot of "bells and whistles" in the budget as proposed.

Warrant articles include budget for next year and to add \$150,000 back into the trust fund for special education services (as this was depleted with the budget crisis next year). This will not be raised by taxpayers. Rather, whatever is left over from the "fun" balance will be put back into this fund. Voters need to approve. We have to have a warrant article annually for this.

The calendar for next year was approved for next year - 8/27 is the first day, 6/15 is the last day. This includes the same amount of early release days throughout the year.

Next School Board meeting is 2/11/2025 at 6pm.
