Welcome and Introductions: President Steph Billingsley

Stephanie Billingsley called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m.

Admin Update: Dr. Lori Collins

<u>Update by Dr. Collins:</u> Some of the things on the horizon - After April break will be the assessment schedule. The state gives us a window in which to complete the assessments. ELA is 2 components (reading/writing), grades 2-8. The week of teacher appreciation will have a testing day. Dr. Collins will maintain contact with the PTA to determine which date works best.

Night of the Arts went very well. We are now in the midst of Missoula theatre. They have the first full cast (62 kids) since COVID.

Tomorrow (3/19/2025), Ms. Reinhelt is getting another STEAM award. This is the second for the program! The commissioner of education will attend to present the award.

Dr. Collins testified before the Senate today regarding loosening the credentials for the school nurse. It is very hard to get someone certified otherwise. We finally got Anita certified. The recommendation is one nurse for every 750 students. We have 700 here, and we meet all criteria.

Town banners on the lamp posts are fading (drawn by AVS students). Dr. Collins asked the selectmen to consider funding another contest with prizes for the kids to redo them. They are about \$1200-\$1500 total. Another thought is to use school donation money to update them. Per a member, the town has not done the contests for the last two years. It used to be done over the holiday break with a given theme.

Per Steph, there may be funds in the cultural line item to use toward this cause. More to come in the next month per Dr. Collins.

<u>Update per Steph:</u> Jennifer Anderson will have final numbers after April 15th. It appears that we surpassed the amount of camps registered last year. Wild Camp allowed a student to stay at the school for an afternoon session to allow for a full day attendance, which also made it easier on parents. The lack of sign-ups and vast range of ages for Wild Camp did not make it an option this year.

We are in talks with Sara Nusbaum to perhaps take over summer camp coordinator once Jennifer Anderson steps down.

- We had to rent a room on AirBNB for 1 director as we did not have multiple host volunteers
 - Consistent issue the last few years
 - Will look to increase our budget to allow for room rentals for next year to relieve the stress

<u>Update by Steph:</u> They are rehearsing presently. An email will be sent to admin and PTA members to push attendance. The show is about 45 minutes long. The tickets are sold at the door and we take cash or credit card. We have to typically find volunteers to host directors. We had to rent a room for one of them this year. The director seems to like the AirBnB room thus far. We will propose an approximate \$2000 increase in the budget to host the directors in their own room. Having the budget to cover this removes the element of stress in trying to find host families.

<u>Update by Steph:</u> Pecuniary benefit for family \$500 for entertainment services - vote needed. Heidi Mader left the room for membership and Board to discuss.

We used a Board member's family member photo booth for the Father/Daughter Dance & Mother/Son event. We are putting to vote to approve the increase to pay. Steph Billingsley made the motion, Jen Alldredge seconded. All in favor. *Motion PASSED*.

School Board Update: Adrian Newton

<u>Update by Adrian:</u> All warrant articles were approved. We are moving \$150,000 into depleted trust fund for special education at the end of the year. At the last meeting, we honored Jason and Ellen for 25 years combined on the board. That was their last meeting. Pinkerton is interested in changing the start time for the school to allow students more sleep. They were originally looking for a 90-minute delay. However, now they want to change it by 15-20 minutes (7:15 to 7:45 a.m.). This impacts AVS because it pushes our start/end times, making them later. It would be a huge inconvenience for AVS. Kids would be getting home later to accommodate a 15-minute change on Pinkerton's end. The School Board is not keen on the idea due to the impact on AVS, but the committee is interested in polling the Town of Auburn. Soon, folks will be getting a start-time survey. This is coming from Pinkerton, so people may not be readily aware of why AVS is sending this inquiry.

Adrian asked how much weight would be given to the survey. It will be interesting to see the results. The School Board has not looked at financial considerations yet. Pinkerton has an all or nothing approach. Candia is echoing concerns too. A lot of sending towns are really interested in the research and feedback. Perhaps Pinkerton would provide transportation. How would this all work? It does not seem feasible for AVS. Tuition would likely go up. The committee continues to hold meetings despite concerns being reported by AVS/School Board. There are many things we can control to allow teens to get enough sleep.

In short, there are many factors that aren't being considered. Another member said that Pinkerton gets out earlier than many other schools in the state. It seems like a lot of upheaval for 15 minutes, but perhaps there are differing perspectives that have not been vocalized yet.

The Board's tech director is working on the Power School breach, although there is not much he can do in this instance. In February, the Board asked him to obtain a letter from Power School that there was no breach, as that is what had been communicated. When asked, Power School then changed its mind and said there was an actual breach. Communication is a problem. Heard on the news that senators are pushing Power School for more answers. Heard that the person responsible was not using dual authentication for their system (there is HIPAA data). It appears the breach contained names, emails, and addresses. Power School is offering security protection and steps per the most recent email last month. Per one member, she received mail saying that her child's medical records were accessed. It is unclear who sent the mail, which lends further concern as to scams.
