Update by Tanya: We could still have some late arrivals purchasing but none yet. Missoula Update: Ami D'Amelio & Christine Duchame

- For the first time since COVID, we had a completely full cast of 62! This means we are back to our normal levels and will be on a first-come, first-served basis as far as permission slips go moving forward.
- We would like to invite anyone even considering, possibly hosting a director for the fall residency to PLEASE reach out to learn more! We are finalizing dates now but looks to be the week of November 10th. There is nothing required beyond a safe and private place to sleep and wifi access.
 If we have no host family, we will need to book an AirBnB which is about \$500 per director
- This residency cost around \$6,985.00 to produce and we raised around \$6,584.00 through fundraising activities related to the shows. This leaves only about \$401.00 for the PTA to cover from other funds, which breaks down to about \$6.46 per child to experience a unique, skill-building, intensive theater program for an entire week! Thank you! :-)
- The Fall 2025 show will be Hercules and looks to be the week of November 10th (still confirming with athletic schedule). This residency will be for grades 1, 3, 5, and 7.
- The 2025-2026 school year will be my last as the Theater Residency Co-Chair ... it is definitely an end to an era! My first residency was October 2011, and March 2026 will be my 26th theater residency over a 15-year span.

Update by Steph: Return to full cast - first-come, first-served basis, so some folks did get turned away. We did have to book an air BnB room for one of the directors. The budget will be increased to account for this possibility moving forward. This will hopefully eradicate any stress associated with rooms. We will always entertain anyone wanting to host. Financial Report - Andrea Sankovich

- Project Safeguard Budget Line Item \$2500 approved to be used for BlueTooth ScoreBoard Remote at October Meeting
 - Total Invoice \$2555 Call for Vote to approve increase of line item by \$55
- Playground/Sports Equipment Budget Line \$3699.90 approved to be used for Playground Landscaping at October Meeting
 - Total Invoice \$4878 Call for Vote to approve increase of line item by \$1,178.10

Update by Andrea: Some line items to highlight – we did payout for the playground landscaping that was voted on in October per request from Dr. Collins. We also paid out for the bluetooth scoreboard and supported Read Across America last month. Middle school offered refreshers, e.g. drinks and cake pops, if they did required reading and sent in logs. There were also \$5.00 gift cards for Barnes & Noble (names drawn) for elementary students.

At the time we approved the landscaping and scoreboard, we only had estimates. Proposal to increase line items for playground landscaping to cover full cost (originally \$3600.00), so want to increase to \$4900 that was spent. The scoreboard also needs to be increased by \$55.00.

***Motion by Steph to increase Project Safeguard line item by \$55.00. Tanya seconded. Motion **PASSED**.

***Motion by Steph to increase the playground sports equipment line item by \$1178.10 to cover actual landscaping cost. Tanya seconded. All in favor. Motion **PASSED**.

School Board Update: Fran Anthony Piascik

Update by Steph: Steph and Tanya were at the school board meeting. They voted in Derek Berger as the chair. Janet remained as second chair. They assigned the new committees at that time. The meeting was exceedingly long. There were quite a few teachers that attended. When Fran volunteered to attend PTA meetings from the school board, he suggested that a PTA member be present at the school board meetings. We are open to this, particularly if it keeps lines of communication open. One member noted that there are a few bills coming down the pipeline. It appears some discussion was had about what policies might need updating as a result and what is being required in the State of New Hampshire. Another member said they may have a write-up of what may be changing, but did not want to alarm anyone because it is ever changing at this time. One member asked if there is a ZOOM option for school board. There have been multiple requests, and it was brought up at the meeting, but it is unclear if this is an option. Regarding the Pinkerton bus survey, there was a high response rate and it was clear that we are not in favor. They were going to take it back to the bigger committee to share results, and they will go off what a majority of the sending towns want. There are bigger issues, too, with having high school kids home when younger kids get off the bus. It would change a lot.

Admin Update: Dr. Collins

Update by Ms. Barnhill: NH SAS testing is coming up for grades 3-8. Starting 5/6/25 (writing assessment), 5/8/25 (reading), 5/13/25 (5th and 8th science), then end with math assessment (5/15). A lot is coming up soon - drama club play happening this week. Drama club has gone

through a lot, lost several members, tough to switch parts and learn lines. To ease stress, only one performance this time around (Friday). Next week we have music concerts for 5th, 6th, 7th. The 7th grade is going on a trip to the Lowell Mills. On 5/22, Andrea Johnson has coordinated a school day concert for the elementary students. Fifth grade has an around town field trip, Dan Carpenter will come in and speak to the kids prior to them getting on the bus. The Coder-Z finals are on 4/23 at Pinkerton. There will be some guidance assemblies at the end of next week to encourage positive mental health and wellness, coping strategies, etc. We want the kids to have as much support as possible. The end of the year is right around the corner! For 8th graders, this is our first year doing a Canobie Lake trip! The kids also love the dinner dance.
